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DR. MARK Y. LI teaches human biology courses at OSSM that include anatomy & physiology, endocrinology, and embryology. Prior to joining the OSSM faculty in 1994, Dr. Li had conducted teaching and research work at Iowa State University, University of Iowa, and Wayne State University. Dr. Li has a Ph.D. and an MS, both in physiology from Iowa State University, and a BS/DVM from Guangxi University in China. He has also been teaching physiology courses at the University of Oklahoma as an adjunct professor.

1989-1998-published more than a dozen full-length papers in peer-reviewed journals in the field of endocrinology.

1994-research grant award (\$23,640) from the American Heart Association, as a principal investigator.

1999-Outstanding Teacher Award (nominated by OSSM graduates), University of Chicago, Chicago, IL.

2002-Appointed as AP Biology Reader by the College Board.

2003- Leader, leading a teacher delegation for an overseas cultural immersion program to China sponsored by the Freeman Foundation and the Experiment in International Living.
