
OSSM MISSION

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of OSSM:

Thank you for your much-needed support of the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics. Without the partnership of individual donors, businesses, and private foundations, OSSM could not be the world class institution that it is, providing transformative academic challenge in STEM to students across Oklahoma.

After a successful fall 2019 semester and strong start in January, COVID-19 struck during Spring Break, forcing us online with classes for the remainder of the spring semester. Our superb faculty responded with lightning speed to take our curriculum online and help students adjust to working from their homes across the state instead of the intensive, highly supportive environment of our main residential campus. It has been and continues to be a very challenging time.

To our knowledge, OSSM was the only Oklahoma school that did not close at all, and our faculty have gone to lengths to maintain the greatest degree of academic rigor and individual support possible online. Our seniors, along with all their peers across the country, were denied Commencement at the end of May; however, we were able to coordinate a safe, socially distanced ceremony for them in late July and send them on their way, with our very best wishes, to their next adventures in higher education.

With 100% of our focus going toward teaching at the highest level possible online, all our summer programs had to be cancelled this year. In an abundance of caution, we began the fall 2020 semester online and, as of this writing, we are still teaching online. We continue to consult with state health officials and have a plan in place to bring students back in person at the earliest date we can safely do so. We are also working on necessary upgrades to the HVAC system in our residence hall and academic buildings to improve air circulation for health and safety as students return to campus.

We are grateful for your continued support of and engagement with OSSM.

RESIDENTIAL

Immersion model supports students' academics

OSSM is a state funded, two-year **residential high school** for Oklahoma juniors and seniors with ability and interest in science and math. Nationally recognized as a top performing high school, OSSM challenges students *far* beyond the traditional high school model. Everything at OSSM supports students' academics—from the school's residential immersion model, college-level curriculum, and largely doctoral-level teaching faculty (91%) to required evening study halls staffed with faculty, peer support, and limited cell phones and personal internet. Students leap forward in their academic progress, with many OSSM graduates receiving numerous credits for their OSSM classes at their chosen institutions of higher learning.



In March, OSSM students went home for Spring Break and finished out the spring semester online due to COVID-19.

STATEWIDE

Bringing advanced education to students across Oklahoma

OSSM also operates seven **Regional Centers** in rural areas across the state located in partnering Career Techs, providing students with calculus, calculus-based physics, and other advanced courses near their homes.

OSSM operates rural Regional Center programs in Drumright, Enid, Muskogee, Okmulgee, Poteau, Tahlequah/Stilwell, and Wayne.

OSSM's **Virtual Regional Center** program works with students and school districts across the state to allow students anywhere in Oklahoma to receive daily interactive instruction online in calculus, calculus-based physics, and other courses AND to receive full face-to-face labs brought to them regularly by our accomplished OSSM instructor. We want to partner and collaborate with more school districts to increase the scope of STEM curriculum they can offer their students!



Class of 2020 Regional Center students finished their senior year online. Wayne Regional Center instructor Tony Cornforth brought a "front porch" graduation to his students from 18 feeder schools—Blanchard, Bridge Creek, Dibble, Elmore City-Pernell, Lexington, Lindsay, Little Axe, Maysville, Newcastle, Noble, Paoli, Pauls Valley, Purcell, Stratford, Wanette, Washington, Wayne, and Wynnewood.

SUMMER PROGRAMS

OSSM typically engages students statewide through **summer program** offerings: Middle School Math & Science Workshops (sponsored), Middle School Math & Science Teachers' Institutes (sponsored), and the OSSM Summer Academies: two separate week-long STEM camps for high school students (fee-based).

Though OSSM was unable to provide regular summer program opportunities this year due to COVID-19, we are grateful to sponsors **Marathon Oil** and **Phillips 66** who allowed support to be redirected to assist with virtual learning and end-ofsummer ramp-up camps for students.

Dr. Brent Richards named Vice President of Academic Services

OSSM Alumnus now leading Faculty at State's leading STEM school



On August 1, 2020, Brent Richards, Ph.D. began his tenure as the new Vice President of Academic Services of the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics! Dr. Richards is responsible for overseeing implementation of OSSM's rigorous,

college-level curriculum in partnership with the school's highly accomplished, largely doctoral-level (91%) teaching faculty.

A member of OSSM's Class of 1996, Dr. Richards started work at OSSM in 2008 as a professor of biology. In addition to teaching, he has served in many other roles, including directing the Student Mentorship program, a hallmark of OSSM academics and a form of learning that integrates hands-on, mentored, professional work experience outside of the classroom. Through partnerships with more than 60 academic institutions, businesses, nonprofit organizations, and government agencies in the Oklahoma City area, OSSM students participate in independent research or other projects in their field of interest under the direction of an experienced professional. More than 500 students have completed mentorship projects since 1992. Dr. Richards earned his B.S. in Biochemistry from the University of Oklahoma in 2000 and his Ph.D. in Neuroscience from Georgetown University in 2006. From 2006-2008, Dr. Richards served as a postdoctoral fellow at the National Institute of Mental Health.

"The Academic Committee of the Board of Trustees and the full Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees and I unanimously selected Dr. Brent Richards as the next Vice President of Academic Services," said Frank Wang, president of OSSM. "Dr. Richards is a true professional who looks for ways he can be helpful and supportive of others. I personally look forward to working closely with him as VP Academic Services."

"I am honored and grateful for this opportunity to serve OSSM in this role," said Dr. Richards. "The school has been a part of my life for more than 20 years, and in all of the places that I have worked or studied I have never felt a greater sense of belonging or purpose."

Finding a Cure for COVID-19

RHIJU DAS, PH.D. | **OSSM CLASS OF 1995** (Bartlesville HS)

Associate Professor of Biochemistry, Stanford University School of Medicine A.B., s.c.l., Harvard University, Physics (1998) M.Phil., Cambridge University, Physics (Radio Astronomy) (1999) M.Res., University College London, Biocomplexity (2000) Ph.D., Stanford University, Physics (2005)

This past summer, Dr. Das was highlighted by PBS on NOVA for the work he is doing to find a vaccine for COVID-19. Though his training was in physics, he has been doing very impressive work for years and now leads a bioscience lab at Stanford. Das gave a fascinating keynote at OSSM Commencement a few years ago on his work to "democratize" science, opening up scientific study to include experience of non-scientists to help arrive at answers more quickly.

After training in particle physics and cosmology at Harvard, Cambridge, University College London, and Stanford, Dr. Das did postdoctoral research in computational protein folding at the University of Washington. On returning to Stanford, Dr. Das set up his lab to focus on computer modeling and design of RNA molecules, which underlie some of the most important molecular machines in biology and medicine. As a core part of this research, Dr. Das leads Eterna, an open science platform that crowdsources intractable RNA design problems to 250,000 players of an online videogame and provides scoring feedback based on actual wetlab experiments.


Dr. Das's research has been recognized by the Burroughs-Wellcome Career Award at the Interface of Science, the OpenEye/ American Chemical Society Outstanding Junior Faculty Award, and the Stanford Medicine Endowed Faculty Scholar award.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Das and Eterna have launched the OpenVaccine challenge to develop refrigeratorstable mRNA vaccines needed for world-wide immunization.

Natasha Bray, D.O., MSEd, FACOI, FACP is certified in internal medicine and addiction. After medical school, she completed her internship as Chief Intern Physician at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine and completed her residency at Cambridge Health Alliance/Harvard Affiliated Hospital. Prior to joining OSU-Cherokee Health Service, Dr. Bray served as the Associate Dean of Clinical Medicine at the Arkansas College of Osteopathic Medicine (ARCOM) in Fort Smith, AR and VP of Academic Affairs/Designated Institutional Official for Broward Health in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

Dr. Bray has extensive experience in the development, accreditation, and delivery of programs at both the undergraduate and graduate levels of medical education. Her current work at OSU for the last four years has focused on establishment (accreditation, curriculum development, hiring, construction, etc.) of the OSU-COM campus in Tahlequah, the nation's first tribally affiliated college of medicine, in partnership with the Cherokee Nation. OSU-COMCN opened in August with an entering class of 54 first year medical students.

"Most of my work centers around using medical education as a venue to address the healthcare disparities that we see in rural and underserved communities. Limitation in access to physicians where large numbers of people live and work, impacts their ability to live healthy lives. Training physicians in rural or underserved communities during their medical school and residency training increases the likelihood that those physicians will stay in the community to practice."

Sarah recently moved back to her hometown of Tulsa to work remotely for Twitter as a Staff User Researcher. For nearly seven years she worked on multiple data research projects during her Biostatistics postdoctoral fellowship at the Harvard Chan School of Public Health. Sarah never saw herself in the tech industry but was interested in the challenges associated with analyzing datasets hundreds of times bigger than what she encountered in public health. She made an abrupt pivot when she was recruited from that fellowship to work in California as a Senior Data Scientist with Netflix and then as a Data Engineering Fellow at Insight Data Science.

"In public health, we start with a hypothesis first then actively collect data specific to our research question, to support or disprove the hypothesis. In tech, any and all data is collected, and people basically hunt for learnings. I think this is the direction the world is moving in."


Sarah is now working with Twitter on projects to improve the global discussion experience. "Long term," she says, "I want to take my experiences from tech and apply them in some public service role, from within the state or federal government, or as a professor."

FURTHER EDUCATION

Of OSSM's 1,791 graduates through 2020, approximately half are still pursuing higher education, **more than half attended college in Oklahoma**, and some **60% are living and working in Oklahoma**. Of those now in the workforce, more than a third are practicing engineers, another third are in medicine and bioscience, and the rest are in computer science & MIS, economics & finance, applied & computational math, chemistry & physics, research, business, law and more.

"OSSM a special place for those who yearn to learn!"

Carleen Burger was one of eight siblings growing up in Oklahoma City. "My mom and dad were emphatic that we get the best education possible," she remembers. "My dad's family were Cherokee. His aunts and uncles went to the Cherokee boarding schools and then on to college—quite unusual for that period in time... The education and persistence of people helped to ensure their well-being," she says. "It was just ingrained in [my family]."

Jerry attended a small rural high school in northeastern Oklahoma. He aspired to attend college but did not feel prepared for academics or dorm life at a big school like University of Oklahoma. He remembers one of his classmates who was so smart, she helped the others with their homework. "She was so bored though," he recalls, "and she definitely did not go

to college. We need OSSM for today's students like her."

Majoring in pre-med, Jerry received his B.S. degree from Northeastern State in Tahlequah in 1967 and then served in the U.S. Army as a member of the Trauma Study Team at Walter Reed Institute of Research. He was a proud member of a research unit deployed to Vietnam in 1968, where he spent a year studying trauma and helped present their findings on Wet Lung Syndrome. He returned from his service as an experienced research medical technologist and started several medical laboratories for physicians in Tulsa.

In 1974, Jerry graduated from the St. Louis University/Washington University Physician Assistant Program as class president and was a founding member of the Missouri Academy and a founding member and president of the Illinois Academy of Physician Assistants. He received his M.S. in Business and Health Administration degrees from the University of Colorado in 1987 and served as Executive Director of the University of Oklahoma Medical Alumni Association 1987-1999. While at the OU Health Sciences Center, Jerry helped establish and grow several endowments for the OUHSC Library, the College of Dentistry, and the College of Public Health.

Believers in the power of endowment to help high quality programs survive and thrive, Jerry and Carleen have helped organize and lead support for OSSM's annual Quantum Experience gala benefiting the OSSM Faculty Endowment. Jerry has served on the OSSM Foundation board since 2005 and helped establish OSSM's mentorship program. He serves on several other boards, as well, and is a long-time Rotary member. The Burgers are active in Rotary's Student Exchange Program and have hosted students from all over the world.

For the Burgers, OSSM is a special place for students who yearn to learn more than is possible in their traditional high school. Three of the Burgers' six children attended OSSM. "The school lets students soar in so many ways," says Carleen. "Our children all had different strengthens and weaknesses. The school helped them develop their potential from the start."

CDR John Burger, M.D. (OSSM'01) now serves in the Navy as Assistant Chief Director of Medical Education at Walter Reed National Medical Center, Nancy Burger (OSSM'05) is now a senior data integration manager, and Will Burger (OSSM'10) is an accomplished engineer currently working in his dream job for the OKC Thunder.

"Jerry and I are so grateful for what OSSM has done for our children," says Carleen. "We want to help ensure others get to have the same experience and to see more students filling the new dorm space. Waiting lists every year make us sad."

Young people with strong STEM skills are badly needed for Oklahoma's changing workforce and that of our nation and the world. 
