“ Over the last year, I’ve witnessed our committed students and dedicated faculty striving for, and achieving, academic excellence. Together, we celebrate their resilience, creativity, and outstanding accomplishments.

The Class of 2025 earned remarkable college admissions results; 46 graduates received \$4.26 million in scholarships, including \$1.4 million awarded to just 4 students. Notably, 57% will remain in Oklahoma, strengthening the state’s academic and scientific future.

Enrollment is also on the rise, with 73 new students in the Class of 2027 and 60 in the Class of 2026. Together, they form a vibrant, diverse community drawn to OSSM’s promise of excellence.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, programs like the Mentorship Program continue to thrive, offering transformative research and academic opportunities. I am deeply grateful to our faculty, staff, alumni, families, and donors for sustaining our mission and creating life-changing opportunities for students.




IRSP



The Investigative Research Scholar Program (IRSP) at OSSM is a leading initiative designed to immerse high-achieving high school scholars in rigorous, result-driven research and training. This program bridges the gap between secondary education and advanced scientific exploration, engaging students in hands-on projects. This year, 21 students participated in projects specializing in Neuroscience, Radiation Biology, Cardiovascular Biology, Pharmaceuticals, Immunology, and Cancer research under the guidance of faculty and staff from private companies, universities, and medical research institutes. This year, our partners were OUHSC, OMRF, and HBE Systems.

The IRSP program is made possible by the OSSM Foundation's IRSP Endowment, which covers the costs of the program. As of 7/31/2025, the IRSP Endowment is valued at \$447K. Quantum Experience



In May 2025, OSSM's signature fundraiser, Quantum Experience, returned after several years. The event raised over \$245,000 for the Faculty Endowment, which helps OSSM attract and retain world-class educators who inspire students to reach their full potential.

This year featured Dr. Caleb Lareau ('11), now an assistant professor at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He shared his journey from OSSM to leading groundbreaking research supported by more than \$7 million in funding.

Mentorship Program



The Mentorship Program is a year-long program offered by OSSM, combining classroom excellence through our distinguished faculty with experiential learning from OSSM faculty and participating partners from the surrounding OKC area. The Mentorship Program fosters the development of future scientists, physicians, engineers, and innovators, instilling professional values, including perseverance, ethical responsibility, and scientific integrity.

Last year, we successfully matched 30 eligible (on-campus) students with mentors from OU (Norman), i2E, Inc., OUHSC, OMRF, culminating in one of the largest groups of eligible students enrolled in the history of the Mentorship Program. The fields taken up by students include Mathematics, Neuroscience, Cardiovascular Biology, Cancer Biology, Immunology, and Aerospace.


